

Notes from Baileys Harbor Downtown Project Group Meeting

October 29, 2016

Meeting location: Lakeshore Park

Meeting purpose: Identify preferred locations for sign, paths, picnic table, benches, garbage and recycling cans, wildflower plantings along the drop-off, etc.

Sign: The double-sided sign should be placed perpendicular to STH 57, on the north end of the property, roughly in line with the storm water runoff rock installation, as close to the road as allowed by state/county regulations. (Mariah will check on the regulations.)

Picnic table and benches: A picnic table and benches should be placed near the group of four trees located in approximately the middle of the park. A solitary bench could also be placed toward the southern end of the park near the cedar trees.

Garbage & recycling cans and doggie “pick-up” post: Consensus that these items need to be placed as unobtrusively as possible. Options discussed: Near the picnic table and benches, or near the storm water runoff rock installation. Also discussed was the possibility of planning some low, native bushes near/around the cans and post so as to screen them further.

Paths: A mulched path should run from the end of the sidewalk to the guardrail and along the inside of the guardrail to wherever the split in the guardrail will (hopefully) be installed. The path may need to swerve around the yellow arrow sign facing south-bound traffic.

A second mulched path should split off of the above path and begin by running toward the water along the lower, flatter ridge to the south of the storm water runoff rock installation. It should then curve to the south and end at the group of trees where the picnic table and benches will be installed. The picnic table and bench area should be mulched so as to eliminate the need for mowing that area.

Plantings: Native wildflower plantings should extend from the edge of the drop-off inland 6-8 feet, beginning from the area near the storm water runoff rock installation and ending just beyond the group of four trees. (An area adjacent to the former beach access steps should be left open within that swath for potential future access to the beach level.) South of the four trees, the group thought native ground cover plantings could be installed if continuing the wildflower strip would be too expensive or too labor-intensive.

Fence: In looking at the vegetation existing at the north end of the lot and the planned layout of the improvements, group members thought a fence might not be necessary on that lot line.

Mariah will call Bobby and Barb to arrange a time to walk the property with them. She will let the group know when that is scheduled so anyone interested can attend.
